Pastor's Message:

Jesus said, "Everyone who acknowledges Me before men, I also will acknowledge before My Father who is in heaven." (Matthew 10:32)

These words of Jesus are part of the introduction to the Rite of Confirmation, which this year will take place during the Sunday morning service on April 13.

For us, Confirmation is many things, serving as a rite of passage for our youth, the completion of grade-school catechesis and instruction in the Christian faith, a sign of membership in the congregation, and the entry into receiving Holy Communion with the congregation. But above all else, it is a public confession of faith.

For the great majority of our children, when they were Baptized, they were unable to speak for themselves, but had sponsors to confess the faith on their behalf. At Confirmation, those children make the same

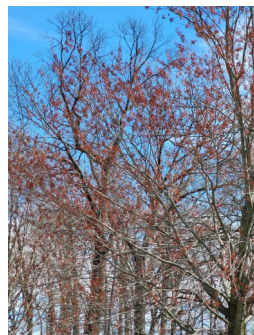

Trinity Lutheran Church Council Meeting
March 4, 2025

Present: Pastor Hojnacki, Ken Fehr, Mark Liefer, Dean Schoenbeck, Brenda Brewer, Robin Booth, Roger Liefer, Mike Koester, Larry Erdmann, Cliff Harms, Danny Salger, Eric Rohlfling, and Lori Woods.

Opening: Chairman Ken Fehr called the meeting to order. Pastor led us in prayer.

Secretary's Report: Kathy was not at the meeting but had arranged for Mark Liefer to take the minutes. The minutes from last month's meeting were sent out to all the Board. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the secretary's report.

Treasurer's Report: Dean provided the treasurer's report. Dean stated our new accountant is a little more expensive, but he hopes to have better service from them. The bill from Cintas for the fire alarm inspection seemed high. One of the church remodel CD's comes due March 11. The council agreed to renew it for 3 months. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the treasurer's report.

Principal's Report: Robin reported that the Friday night dance was enjoyed by all who attended. She gave Brenda a check as the school gives 10% of all fund raising profit to the church. May 2 will be the school open house.

Pastor's Report: Pastor reported that church attendance in February was good as the average attendance was 130 per weekend. Pastor reported two official acts: the baptism of Briggs Burmester and the baptism of Ava Seiber. Pastor participated in the installation of Mark Winkelman as the full-time pastor at St. John, Red Bud. Pastor and Larry Erdmann attended the SID District Convention where Reverend Heath Curtis was elected as the new District President. Palm Sunday and confirmation will be on April 13 with four students being confirmed. The questioning for the students will be April 9. The Easter service will be on April 13.

Elder's Report: Roger Langrehr has agreed to complete the term made available when Marvin Stellhorn stepped down as Elder. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to have Roger Langrehr to fill this position as Elder which runs through January 2026.

School Board Report: The Trinity school accreditation team will be here March 10 and 11. The Trinity fish fry is March 14.

Trustees Report: Eric reported that Prime Cutting LLC provided a quote to perform the lawn service for Trinity at the same price charged in 2024. The church council agreed to award the 2025 work to him as he did a great job for us in 2024. Ameren will be installing another pole and light on the east side of the church parking lot to better illuminate this area and reduce the issues which have occurred in the past. Eric has been in contact with the Randolph County highway group to see if anything can be done to improve the drainage of the area east of the church parking lot between Prairie Road and the sidewalk. Eric, Danny Salger, and Mark Liefer met with Clint Kapp of Warnecke to discuss work on the church exterior. Clint is taking over as the lead person for Warnecke following the passing of Randy Warnecke. Water infiltration is the main problem which needs to be addressed before any interior redecoration can be considered. The louvers on the steeple need to be replaced as they have allowed water to enter

the church and damaged the church interior roof plaster on both the north and south sides on second floor. In the past there was water damage up high behind the altar which was possibly caused by the chimney connection to the church. The top portion of the chimney needs to be removed, the chimney totally sealed over, and the roof sealed in this area. There is missing and loose tuck pointing in many areas. The church exterior needs to be high pressure washed, required tuck pointing performed, and the exterior coated with a water proofing material. Clint will provide an estimate for the work but informed the group that this work would be performed in two phases.

The meeting was adjourned, Pastor led us in the Lord’s Prayer.

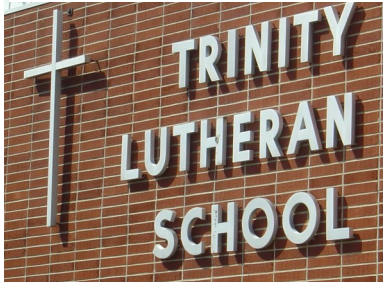

Last Day of school is *tentatively* Tuesday, May 27th.

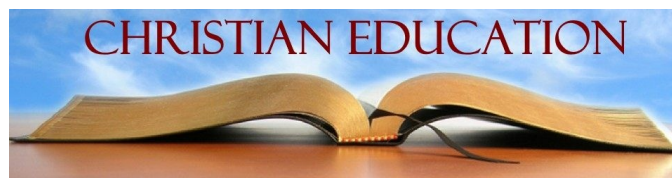
We will approve the school calendar for next year once the teachers have reviewed it.

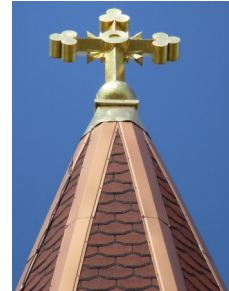

Trinity Church Exterior

With the Lord begin this project...

In 2017, Warnecke replaced the shingles on the very top portion of the church steeple along with all of the copper, aluminum, and lead metal components in this top structure. Before installing the shingles, they modified the structure by removing the “trap door” and installing new framing and new plywood. The decision was made to do this as that trap door was a continual source of leakage. It was agreed that any future repairs would be made using a tall manlift on the outside of church rather than going through this door. A couple years before this upgrade, the cross was brought down, replated, and reinstalled.



The next level down contains the louvers which allow the sounds of our church bells to go out into the countryside and to be heard inside the church when the front door is opened.

The age of these louvers is unknown, but they have been there for a very long time. During rainstorms accompanied by strong winds, these louvers have allowed water to get inside the steeple area and have caused water damage to the ceiling areas on second floor above both the north and south sets of stairs.



Randy Warnecke was contacted to look at the louvers and give his opinion on what we could do to stop the water leakage and resultant damage. He looked at the louvers with binoculars in October 2024 and gave a rough estimate of \$50,000 to replace the louvers and do tuck point repairs to this area of the steeple. In November Randy and



Clint Kapp came back with a tall manlift and did a thorough inspection of this area and the rest of the church. Randy stated that the louvers should be replaced with an upgraded design that would prevent water from entering this area. In addition to the tuck pointing needed on the steeple, he suggested high pressure washing the entire church, repairing any bad tuck pointing, and sealing the brick (sealing of the brick had been done over 10 years ago).

Unfortunately, Randy Warnecke (60 years old) died unexpectedly on January 14, 2025! While the Warnecke family was in our thoughts and prayers, we were also concerned about the future of his business and our church repair. Mark Liefer called the Warnecke business phone number and eventually spoke to Clint Kapp, a 19-year employee of the Warnecke business. The original longer-range “plan” was for Clint to take over the business when Randy retired in a few years.

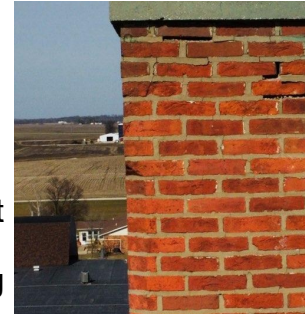
Eric Rohlfig, Danny Salger, and Mark Liefer met with Clint Kapp at the church on March 4, 2025 to discuss needed work on the church exterior. While earlier than

planned, Clint informed us that he was taking over as the lead person for Warnecke and the business name would remain the same.

Water infiltration is the main problem which needs to be addressed before any interior redecoration can be considered. Indeed, the louvers on the steeple need to be replaced as stated earlier. In the past there was water damage up high behind the altar which was possibly caused by an issue with the chimney connection to the church. The top portion of the chimney needs to be removed, the chimney totally sealed over, and the roof needs to be sealed in this area. There is missing and loose tuck pointing in many areas. The church exterior needs to be high pressure washed and the exterior coated with a water proofing material prior to tuck pointing. Clint will provide an estimate for the work but informed the group that this work would be performed in two phases: 1) high-pressure wash, tuck point repair, and brick sealing and 2) louver replacement (a bit later).



As discussed at several church council meetings, repairing the outside of the church must be accomplished before the inside can be redecorated.

Watch for progress reports in upcoming issues of Trinity Tidings as this work begins and progresses.
