The Lesson of the Candy Corn

So shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it (Isaiah 55:11)

Every autumn a fresh crop of candy corn pops up in the stores and reminds us that harvest time is near. Invented in the 1880s, candy corn has been enjoyed for over 130 years. Now that is sweet success! This see-shaped confection can become a symbol of God's Word and how He uses us to accomplish His heavenly harvest.

Read the Parable of the Sower (Luke 8:8-15). Jesus wants us to be generous in scattering His seed so that all might have the chance to hear God's Word and the message of salvation. Now take a look at what each color of the candy corn represents.

White—The tip of the candy corn is pure white and stands for God the Father who is perfect, holy, and righteous. The see is His Word we are to proclaim to others.

Orange—The color orange reminds us of the flames of the Holy Spirit who appeared on Pentecost. He enabled the disciples to speak God's Word in many languages. The large tapered section of this candy also represents the large harvest field There are many who need to hear God's offer of forgiveness. It is the Holy Spirit who takes the seed of God's Word and nurtures faith in man's heart.

Trinity Lutheran Church Council Meeting September 3, 2024

Present: Pastor Hojnacki, Tim Luebkemann, Mark Liefer, Kathy Nagel, Dean Schoenbeck, Byron Burmester, Robert Nagel, Marvin Stellhorn, Darrell Salger, and Robin Booth.

Opening: Chairman Tim Luebkemann called the meeting to order. Pastor led us in prayer.

Secretary's Report: The minutes from last month's meeting were sent out to all the Board. A motion was made, seconded, and moved to accept the secretary report.

Treasurer's Report: Dean reported that August had good donations to the roof fund and was able to pay off \$6,880.00 of that loan. So, the balance remaining in the Liefer Roof loan is \$6,950.57. He also reported that the Mission offerings were good again this month and we should be able to reach our commitment.

Principal's Report: The school year started out well with 40 students, 13 of those being in preschool. With that number of students in pre-school it is a state law that there must be two teachers. So, we are needing to hire someone part-time for three hours in the morning. Currently, Angie's mother, Karen is helping until we hire someone. A Soc Hop is planned for the students in September.

Pastor's Report: Attendance for August was consistent with average of 120 each weekend. In official acts, August 24 was the wedding of Brie Luebkemann and Austin Dillow. This Sunday is the beginning of Sunday School and Bible Class. Wednesday Bible Class begins tomorrow, September 4. Youth Confirmation classes will begin Sunday evening, September 8. A brief voters meeting will be scheduled for September 22, following the morning church service. With the SID Convention coming up in February, a lay delegate and alternate to the convention needs to be elected. Also nominations for District offices will be accepted. The mission budget must be voted on for next year. After discussion, a motion was made and moved to recommend to the congregation to leave the mission budget the same. Currently it is at \$15,000, with \$5,000 going to Christ Our Savior and \$10,000 going to the District. If we go over the budget, that excess will be split evenly between COSLHS and the District.

Elder's Report: The elders are assisting Pastor in the accreditation that is being done this year.

School Board Report: Nothing to report.

A letter was received from Rebecca (Juelfs) Kohne announcing her resignation as Youth Group leader effective next summer after they return from the 2025 National Youth Gathering. She has been one of our Youth Group leaders for the past 14 years. She wanted to give ample notice to find a replacement and to be able to work together with them to show them how things are done. If anyone is interested or has any questions, please contact Rebecca at 618,967-7601. We thank her for her many years of serving as Youth Leader for our congregation.

The meeting was adjourned. Pastor led us in the Lord's Prayer.

DISTRICT CONVENTION DELEGATE: A lay delegate from our congregation needs to attend the LCMS SID Convention to be held early 2025. Larry Erdmann and Michael Koester volunteered to be on the ballot. A motion was made and moved to accept the ballot. After ballot voting, Larry was elected as the delegate and Michael will be the alternate.

DISTRICT CONVENTION NOMINATIONS: Pastor Hojnacki has been serving as our Circuit Visitor for the last 3 years. His term is up and needs to be filled. A motion was made to nominate Pastor to again serve as our Circuit Visitor. Motion passed.

The meeting was adjourned.

Sunday School teachers were installed this day. Andrea, Sarah, and Marilyn were present. May God bless your teaching.





Opening devotion was led by Pastor Hojnacki.

Attendance: Dr Booth, Lori Woods, Charlotte Schnepel, Jonathon Mehring, Julie Fehr, Tim Luebkemann, Cheri Lange, Pastor Hojnacki

Sunday school report: Off to a good start, all teaching and admin positions are covered.

Finance report: Approved as presented.

Administration report: Health dept is coming in on Oct 7th to offer flu shots to faculty and staff. The fire department will be here for Fire Prevention week on Oct 17th. This Friday the 27th is a Teacher Institute day, the staff will be talking about curriculum mapping and what to expect with accreditation. Dr Booth has done 3 teacher observations so far, more to come. She is also looking into the possibility of offering an online coding class to the Jr high students. One of the AC units at school has gone out and the one in the PreK room is acting up also. Dr Booth suggested that Trinity school continues to donate 10% of each fundraiser to the church to help defray some costs of repairs at the school. The Board voted to continue this practice. Jonathon asked about the possibility of getting a permanent Trinity Lutheran School sign at Rte 3 and South Prairie Rd. We will table this for now until more information can be found. The sock hop was well attended and everyone had a great time.

MAP test scores will be given out at PT conferences in October Substitute teacher pay will be increased to \$110 a day to be competitive in our area. Rachel Salger is the new Teachers aide for Preschool and Kathleen Nagel has accepted the aftercare position.
